Y10 DHL Outward Bound Trip

Half Term 5 saw the return of the DHL Outward Bound trip to Aberdovey, Wales. Pupils were chosen for this trip by attending a selection day, set up like the selection days used at major companies, such as DHL, who run the trip. The trip is designed to push pupils to their limits, to help them build their confidence and to build key employability skills such as resilience and teamwork. Miss Everard and Mrs Jordan were the lucky staff members chosen to accompany the pupils on this trip.

Upon arriving in Wales, pupils got to know their instructor with a variety of team building games. They also began to pack key equipment for their overnight expedition, which was due to take place the following day.

On Tuesday, the pupils set out for their expeditions. We explored local beaches, before being dropped off at a log cabin, roughly an 8km hike from the cabin in which we'd stay overnight. The pupils walked for over 6 hours up mountainous terrain, over streams, rocks and extremely wet ground. They purified water from a stream to drink, learned to navigate using a map and even saw a world famous dirt bike racing track. Eventually they reached the lodge where we were staying for the night, and fetched water in which to warm up their ration packs for dinner, which were appetisingly named 'wet food pack'. Pupils played Uno and shared scary stories before retiring to bed.

Pupils returned to the Outward Bound Centre the next morning and showed fantastic self-responsibility in packing up their equipment and the equipment of others. Upon returning to the centre, the pupils had a turn on Jacobs ladder, all encouraging one another to push past their fears of heights to climb as far as possible. At this point, our pupils met Sonia, the head of the Outward Bound project at DHL (which is a pretty big deal!). She spent the next two days with our pupils and was floored by the level of maturity and compassion with which our pupils behaved.

On Thursday, pupils engaged in water activities, canoeing to an island for lunch and then back again. Pupils formed a diamond formation in their boats, so had to work as an incredibly close knit team to make the boats move. They then took part in the jetty jump where they jumped around 12-15 feet off a jetty into the open sea! This part of the trip really showcased their bravery, determination and care for one another as I watched every pupil jump in, cheered on by their classmates.
