Summer Building Work Projects at NGA

During the summer holiday we are going to be making some changes at Nottingham Girls' Academy ready for next term.

The ROSLA block, where pupils currently have drama, history, and geography lessons and where our pupils in the Alternative Curriculum groups study, is being transformed into our new Sixth Form Centre.

It will have a brand new dedicated sixth form science laboratory, a large common room, a large study room and space for all of our Sixth Form lessons.

At the same time, 4 of our PC rooms in the main block are being transformed into normal classrooms for humanities and English lessons and we will be replacing the PCs with brand new laptops so that all classrooms can be 'PC rooms' when required.



Finally, a brand-new dedicated Drama building will be installed on our Active Yard.

We are also building some new offices in our dining room block so that during the first half term the canteen block toilets can be totally refurbished, with 11 new toilets being installed.

Behaviour and Attendance

As you will hear from Mrs Turner-Ramadan in a separate letter, we are making some alterations to our behaviour policy. We will retain our focus on building positive relationships through praise and recognition and an ethos of providing our young people the opportunity to learn from their inevitable mistakes wherever possible. However, we are also launching the NGA Way for Behaviour and Attitudes which we hope will provide clearer expectations regarding manners, attendance and punctuality, classroom behaviour, managing conflict and uniform, as well as making clear the sanctions that will be awarded if pupils do not positively contribute to our school community by meeting these expectations. Please read the information carefully when it is sent.

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Uniform

As mentioned above, wearing the correct uniform will be a continued focus next year. We believe that wearing our distinctive uniform gives our pupils a sense of 'belonging', helps foster pride in themselves and the Academy and removes issues arising from peer pressure or inequity.

Our pupils are our ambassadors in the community. We therefore expect pupils to wear full Academy uniform when travelling to and from the school, at all Academy functions, on extra-curricular visits and when taking part in representative sport.

Unlike some local schools, we are not asking you to purchase branded items of clothing for almost every aspect of the uniform. The schools that have made this choice, have done so to ensure that they have tighter control over what pupils wear, but we believe that it adds an unnecessary cost - particularly as the cost of living continues to rise.

Therefore, our main uniform contains only two branded items – a purple (Key Stage 3) or black (Key Stage 4) Academy jumper and an Academy tie. The rest (shirt, trousers, skirts, shoes) can be purchased from a huge range of retailers that supply school uniform (such as Asda, Tesco, Marks and Spencer, Next, etc).

Piercings and Hair Colour

This is also a useful moment to mention piercings and hair colour.

If your child is going to have additional ear or face piercing this summer, please could you do that at the very beginning of the holiday so that piercings that are not acceptable in the school uniform code we only allow one piercing in the bottom of the lobe of each ear and no other facial piercings - can be removed during the school day.

Similarly, if your child is going to dye their hair an unnatural colour during the holiday, please leave sufficient time for it to be able to be returned to a natural hair colour for their return in September.

Thousands of Nottingham children are set to benefit from free holiday clubs again this Summer.

Nottingham Forest Community Trust is delighted to announce that in partnership with Nottingham City Council, Free Fun and Food is back!

The largest programme in the Trust's history, Free Fun and Food provides enriching activities and healthy meals to thousands of local children from families who could benefit from extra support over the holidays.
