RE: Nottingham Girls' Academy Examination Results 2022

When I wrote to you before half term, I was anticipating confirmation that last year's GCSE results were our best ever.

I am delighted to say that that is the case!

As you can see from the table below, pupils at NGA performed significantly higher than the Local Authority average (Nottingham City) - and also higher than the national average in every key category:

In particular, we are thrilled that our Progress 8 score of +0.47 places us as the **top state secondary school in the city for progress!** (Based on the progress that pupils made between their Key Stage 2 SATs and their GCSEs last summer).

In fact, it places us as 5th in the entire county - and when they republish figures in February 2023, and the DfE includes some results of ours that they have missed out, we expect to be 2nd or 3rd!
